OUR LEADERSHIP

At Cornerstone, we believe that Jesus Christ leads the universal Church and our local church. He has authority over all things and is our Head. While on earth, Jesus modeled servant leadership and exercised His authority in humility - the opposite of typical human leadership. (Matthew 20:25-28)

Jesus now leads His Church through delegated leadership. As the early Church multiplied, the apostles appointed local leaders (elders and deacons) to be responsible for keeping the church focused on its mission and for the spiritual care of the people. The qualifications for these leaders were centered around excellent moral character, devotion to God and His Word, and wise living. (1 Peter 5:1, 1 Timothy 3:1-7, Titus 1:5-9)

The leadership of Cornerstone Church follows the pattern that Jesus and the New Testament Church initiated. We appoint servant leaders who exercise delegated authority to pursue the mission of the church and to provide spiritual care for our people.

Our church government can best be described as Elder-led, Staff-driven.

The elders and staff work in relationship with other teams, the deacons and the congregation to carry out the vision and mission of the church.

CORNERSTONE LEADERSHIP STRUCTURE

Here are some questions we need to answer:

What do the elders do?

An Elder is an overseer in charge of the oversight of a local body of believers. Simply put, Elders should be Godly men exemplifying the qualities of loyalty, sound judgment, humility, peacemaking, fiscal responsibility, and sobriety. Elders will be members of Cornerstone Church and in "active standing". Elders will have demonstrated leadership qualities within the established ministries of the Church.

They are expected to teach, set vision and direction for the church, attend meetings to conduct church business. They also pray for, fellowship with, and provide visitation to members of the body. Their actions demonstrate a contribution to the spirit of Biblical unity and support among the Pastors, staff, and congregation of Cornerstone Church. Elders are expected to give financially in both a systematic and sacrificial manner to support the mission and vision of Cornerstone Church. An Elder will serve on a rotation as new elders are selected.

What do the deacons do?

In the Bible, the responsibilities of a deacon are not clearly listed or outlined; they are assumed to be everything that does not include the duties of an Elder or Pastor (which is to preach, teach, exhort, etc.)

Deacons are Godly men dedicated to serving in practical and spiritual ways within the local body. The deacons ensure that the day-to-day operations of the church can be carried out in a timely and effective manner. They perform many of the "behind the scenes" functions for preparation and clean up for ministry activities and events. Deacons are members of Cornerstone Church and in "active standing". They will be Christ followers as evidenced by their life. Their actions will demonstrate a contribution to the spirit of Biblical unity among the Pastors, Elders, staff, and congregation of Cornerstone Church. Deacons are expected to give financially in both a systematic and sacrificial manner to support the mission and vision of Cornerstone Church. A Deacon will serve for a defined period once selected.

What about pastors and church staff?

The Cornerstone staff includes men and women serving in both ministerial and non-ministerial roles. Staff are appointed by the senior leadership team.

What about congregational voting?

The following items require congregational voting:

- Amendments to the Church Constitution and By-Laws
- The sale or purchase of church owned property
- The "calling" of a Senior Pastor

WHY CONSIDER MEMBERSHIP?

We believe there are at least four good reasons for considering membership.

Membership is BIBLICAL (Acts 6:1-6; Romans 16:1-19)

Although the word "membership" is never used in the New Testament in the sense of "church membership," we find the idea is quite Biblical. Throughout the Scriptures, believers identified themselves with a local community. They gave themselves to a group of other, likeminded believers for the common cause of advancing the Kingdom of God in their world. Each individual believer is identified as a "part" of the body of Christ and, as such, is to live out the Christian life in a coordinated way with other believers.

Membership ties you to THE MISSION OF JESUS.

While the overall mission of Jesus is not realized by having an organization called the church, it is fulfilled through the people who comprise and define the church. In our big, busy, "global perspective" world, it's easy to lose sight of the fact that individual people are the defined mission of the church. The single lost sheep from Matthew 18:12-13 is the mission. That means that you and I are the mission. It's also a certainty that the neighbor living across the street and the person working alongside you for years...are the mission too!

Jesus established His church to carry out the mission that He started, and He has left us here to complete the task. Joining a church is not about paying your "dues", becoming a part of "the club", and getting to claim some great perks. Church membership is actually about joining with others who seriously want to become a part of the mission. It's all about the people and it is done most effectively as part of a community. We all have gifts and skills that we can use better together as we seek and serve lost and hurting people; as we see dead people come to life in Christ; and as we share with other like-minded people to experience mutual growth in spiritual wisdom and maturity.

So, if you're just looking for somewhere to show up now and then, throw some money in from time to time, feel good about yourself, and enjoy some of the perks, Cornerstone Church is probably not the place for you However, if you want to be challenged to really grow in Christ and community, to learn and mature as you serve along with others, and become an active participant in the mission that Jesus Himself defined for us, then we encourage you to jump right in! Get serious about the mission; begin by becoming a member of the church.

Membership ENABLES/EMPOWERS MINISTRY (1 Cor 12:12-20)

Next, as the work here grows, it is important for the leadership to be able to identify those who can be counted on to pitch in. We don't want anyone to feel pressured but, at a practical level, we need to know those who feel God has called them to be co-laborers here. These are the ones who truly do the work of the ministry of Cornerstone Church. They are the ones the leadership has in focus when planning for training, equipping, and growth.

One of the tools we use for identifying how people fit in service at Cornerstone is through a spiritual gifts assessment. We have included one at the end of this booklet...so take some time over the next few weeks to complete the assessment then speak to Pastor Mark, one of the staff members or Elders to see where you can step into service to strengthen the church.

Membership requires COMMITMENT (Heb 10:23-25)

We live in a society where commitment and faithfulness seem to be taken lightly. We feel that reminding people that the Christian life is one involving a certain amount of commitment is valuable. We want to encourage everyone to consider backing up their good intentions for growth in the Christian life with some definite and appropriate life decisions. Commitment to a local fellowship can help an individual Christian take a step toward further growth. We see membership as a way for a Christian to affirm his or her commitment to a group of believers in his or her local area for the purpose of mutual growth. This being so, there are some "minimum requirements" for membership in any church—and that includes Cornerstone Church.

Membership requires COMMITMENT TO JESUS FIRST

Since the local church is a gathering of those who belong to the larger Body of Christ, only those who are members of the Body of Christ can be members of a local church.

Membership is not a "right" that you have because you attend services at a church. Membership is a commitment a believer can make because he or she has come to faith in Jesus.

Thus, before considering membership in a local church, you need to consider whether you belong to Jesus. Without a personal relationship with Him, membership in a local church is inappropriate. (If you have questions about where you are in your journey with God, don't hesitate to talk with one of the pastors.)

Because membership is a public declaration of one's commitment to a local church, there is another public declaration which is a reasonable prerequisite to membership.

Specifically, we believe only those who have been baptized as believers are proper candidates for membership in a local church.

We believe baptism—where a believer is immersed in water—is a public confession of one's commitment to Jesus.

Seeing as it is part of a believer's declaration of faith, we think it rightly precedes a commitment to a local gathering of Christians. (If you haven't been baptized by immersion or you have questions about it, just mention your interest to someone in leadership or contact the church office.)

EXPECTATIONS OF MEMBERS

At Cornerstone Church we take spiritual growth seriously. We believe every member should be plugged into a small group of some kind in order to grow...but small groups are also a place where we are able to care for and support one another. We believe the church has been given the responsibility to care for and support one another (Eph 4) and it's not the job of the pastor and staff but the job of the members. By joining Cornerstone Church, you are not only committing to be plugged into a small group but you are also committing to caring and supporting the other members of the church, especially those in your small group.

We also believe that every believer and member should be a giver. Jesus modeled giving perfectly for us and we should learn to be generous givers. By committing to membership at Cornerstone church, you are also committing to becoming a systematic and sacrificial giver in the church. Giving happens when we give of our time, talent and treasure.

Giving of your time happens by investing in others and serving in the church. Giving of your talent happens by using your spiritual gifts to strengthen the church, and you will give of your treasure (your money) in order to further the mission and vision of the church. We consider it a privilege to give back to God. Luke 6:38 says, "Give, and it will be given to you. They will pour into your lap a good measure-pressed down, shaken together, and running over. For by your standard of measure it will be measured to you in return."

5 Personal Benefits of Committing to a Local Church Family

- It identifies me as a GENUINE BELIEVER. (Eph 2:19, Rom 12:5)
- It provides me with a SPIRITUAL FAMILY to support and encourage me. (Gal 6:1-2)
- It gives me a place to DISCOVER and USE MY GIFTS in ministry. (1 Cor 12:4-27)
- It places me under the Spiritual Protection of godly leaders. (Heb 13:17, Acts 20:28-29)
- It gives me the ACCOUNTABILITY to grow. (Eph 5:21)

Expectations as a Member

At Cornerstone Church, we never ask our members to do more than the Bible clearly teaches. We only expect our members to do what the Bible expects every Christian to do. These responsibilities are spelled out in the Membership Covenant.

MEMBERSHIP COVENANT

OUR BELIEFS

The Scriptures

The Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is God's revelation of Himself to man. It is divine instruction with God as its author, salvation for its end, and truth, without any mixture of error, for its matter and therefore has authority over our lives. All Scripture is totally true and trustworthy, and is a testimony to Christ.

2 Tim 3:15-17, 2 Pet 1:19-21

God

There is one and only one living and true God. He is an intelligent, spiritual, and personal Being, the Creator, Redeemer, Preserver, and Ruler of the universe. The eternal triune God reveals Himself to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

God the Father

God as Father reigns with providential care over His universe, His creatures, and the flow of the stream of human history according to the purposes of His grace. *Gen 1:1, Matt 6:9, Matt 28:19*

God the Son

Christ is the eternal Son of God. Jesus Christ was conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. Jesus perfectly revealed and did the will of God, taking upon Himself human nature yet without sin. In His substitutionary death on the cross He made provision for the redemption of men from sin. He was raised from the dead with a glorified body, appeared to His disciples, ascended to heaven, and is now exalted at the right hand of God where He is the One Mediator.

God the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of God, fully divine.

He inspired holy men of old to write the Scriptures. Through illumination He enables men to understand truth. He exalts Christ. He convicts men of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment. He calls men to the Savior, and effects regeneration whereby He baptizes every believer into the Body of Christ.

Man

Man is the special creation of God, made in His own image. By his free choice man sinned against God and brought sin into the human race. Since the Fall, humanity now inherits a nature and environment inclined toward sin. Only the grace of God can bring man into His holy fellowship and enable man to fulfill the creative purpose of God.

Salvation

Salvation involves the redemption of the whole man, and is offered freely to all who accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, who by His own blood obtained eternal redemption for the believer. There is no salvation apart from personal faith in Jesus Christ as Lord.

God's Purpose of Grace

Election is the gracious purpose of God, according to which He regenerates, justifies, sanctifies, and glorifies sinners. It is consistent with the free agency of man. Those whom God has accepted in Christ, and sanctified by His Spirit, will never fall away from the state of grace, but shall persevere to the end.

The Church

A New Testament church is an autonomous local congregation of baptized believers, associated by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the gospel exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by His Word, and seeking to extend the gospel to the ends of the earth.

The New Testament speaks also of the church as the Body of Christ which includes all of the redeemed of all the ages, believers from every tribe, and tongue, and people, and nation.

Baptism and the Lord's Supper

Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in water as an act of obedience symbolizing the believer's faith in a crucified, buried, and risen Savior, the believer's death to sin, the burial of the old life, and the resurrection to walk in newness of life in Christ. The Lord's Supper is an act of obedience whereby believers memorialize the death of the Redeemer and anticipate His coming.

Last Things

God, in His own time will bring the world to its appropriate end. Jesus will return personally and visibly in glory to the earth; the dead will be raised; and Christ will righteously judge all men. The unrighteous will be consigned to Hell, the place of everlasting punishment. The Kingdom

Evangelism and Missions

It is the duty and privilege of every follower of Christ and of every church of the Lord Jesus Christ to endeavor to make disciples of all nations. Christ has commanded the preaching of the gospel to all nations. It is the duty of every child of God to seek constantly to win the lost to Christ by verbal witness undergirded by a Christian lifestyle.

Stewardship

God is the source of all blessings, temporal and spiritual; all that we have and are we owe to Him. According to the Scriptures, Christians should contribute of their means cheerfully, regularly, systematically, proportionately, and liberally for the advancement of the Redeemer's cause on earth.
